

CENTRAL PARK GREENSBOROUGH, MASTER PLAN

COUNCIL SEEKS COMMUNITY IDEAS

Banyule City Council has commissioned the preparation of a master plan to guide the future development of Central Park in Greensborough.

The Park offers an attractive mix of sporting facilities, open grassland and informal treed areas and is located between Plenty Lane and Elder Street, Greensborough.

Council's objective in commissioning the master plan is to identify ways by which Central Park can better meet growing sporting needs while also providing for improved informal use by a wider cross-section of the community.



The Park provides a junior sports oval that is used for soccer and cricket, Grace Valley Tennis Club with 4 courts and club rooms, a small playground, an older style toilet block, sealed car parking and extensive areas of informal lawns and woodlands.



Banyule Council would like to invite all residents, community groups and other interested parties to make an input to the master plan study. A community walk in Central Park and public meetings will be held in February of 2012 but earlier input and ideas are invited.
