Parking rules

There are rules about where you can stop or park your car in Banyule which you must follow. If you don't follow these rules you may be fined.

Some common rules are:

Parking time limits – Parking signs tell you how long you can park your car in a certain area. You must not park your car any longer than the time shown on the sign.

Parking on nature strips – The nature strip is the grass area alongside a road. You must not park your car on a nature strip.

No stopping signs – Where there is a 'No Stopping' sign, you must not stop your car for any reason, even if you stay in your car or leave your motor running.

Loading Zones – Loading Zones are used by commercial vehicles to deliver or collect items as part of their job. You must not park your car in a 'Loading Zone' unless you have been given a permit from VicRoads.

Disabled parking - Parking spaces for people with a disability are shown by a sign with a wheelchair. These parking spaces can only be used by people with a disability who have a permit called a Category 1 Permit. Disabled parking permits are free. If you have a disability and need a permit, call Council.

Fire hydrants – Fire hydrants are located around Banyule to give quick access to water for putting out fires. The hydrants are usually on the nature strip and may be silver with a red top or a flat round black plastic lid on the ground. You must not park within one metre of a fire hydrant.

Parking across a driveway or on a footpath

You must not park your car across any part of a driveway entrance or passenger access. It is also an offence to park a vehicle on any part of a footpath.

Selling a car – You must not park your car on a road, nature strip or in any other public place to advertise it for sale. If you do so you may be fined.

Repairing cars – You must not repair cars on a road, nature strip or other public place or you may be fined.

Unregistered cars – Cars that are broken down or not registered with VicRoads must not be left or parked on the road or in any public place. Council may collect your car and you will have to pay to get it back and you may be fined.
