

SIMMS ROAD OVAL MASTER PLAN

What Would You Like to See Provided or Improved?

Banyule City Council has commissioned the preparation of a master plan to guide the future development of the Simms Road Oval in Montmorency.

The Oval is at the end of Simms Road, off Para Road, adjacent to the Plenty River and on the border of Greensborough and Montmorency.

Council's objective in commissioning the master plan is to identify ways by which the Oval and the surrounding parkland can better meet community sporting needs while also providing improved opportunities for informal use by the wider community.



At present, the reserve has a junior sports oval that is used for football and cricket, cricket practice nets, and old, inadequate change/toilet facilities. The reserve is linked to the Plenty River Trail and a footbridge provides an immediate link to Willinda Park and the regional athletics track.



Banyule Council would like to invite all residents, community groups and other interested parties to make an input to the master plan study. A walk in the park and public meetings will be held in February of 2012 but earlier input and ideas are also invited.
