

Environment Grants 2020 Program Guidelines

Purpose

Banyule City Council has designed the Environment Grants to encourage and assist community involvement in the achievement of our environmental goals. It is aimed to improve and increase;

- The maintenance and enhancement of the natural environment;
- Climate change mitigation and adaptation;
- The conservation of resources including materials, water and energy;
- The reduction in waste and pollution; and
- The encouragement of environmental stewardship in the community.

The Environment Grants program is provided as an incentive to new or established groups and individuals to develop initiatives, workshops, projects and campaigns that achieve these aims.

Grant Pool

For 2020/21, the Environment Grants have been split into two rounds of \$55,000 each. The maximum an individual grant can be awarded is \$10,000 in cases of exceptional projects. There is no minimum grant amount awarded.

Round One was open 14 July – 13 September 2020. **Round Two** will be open 19 January – 16 March 2021.

Environment Grants can be fully funded or partially funded. If partially funded Council will specify what aspects of the application will be covered.

All applicants are required to read the guidelines and discuss their project idea with the Environment Grants Officer before starting a submission.

Important Dates

The following dates outline the schedule for the 2020/21 Environment Grants Program Round 2:

- 1. Environment Projects Grants applications open: 19 January 2021.
- 2. Environment Projects Grants applications close: 16 March 2021.
- 3. Applications assessed 17 March 20 April 2021.
- 4. Applicants notified of outcomes: 27 April 2021.

	5. Projects must be acquitted by 10 June 2022.
	Late applications will not be accepted.
Eligibility Criteria	To be eligible to apply for the Environment Projects Grant you must:
	✓ Have a project taking place 2021 or 2022.
	✓ Be a not-for-profit organisation/community group, individual or Incorporated Body (or be auspiced by one).
	✓ Be based within Banyule City Council Local Government area and/or propose to provide services and activities within these boundaries.
	✓ Have an ABN or be able to submit a <u>Statement by Supplier</u> .
	✓ Have appropriate Public Liability Insurance and adhere to equal opportunity principles and sounds work place health and safety practices.
	 ✓ Be able to demonstrate financial viability by a current detailed profit and loss statement (preferred) or a detailed, current financial statement. Bank statements are not appropriate and should not be submitted.
	✓ Have been established for a minimum of 12 months.
	Note: The auspicing entity must accept responsibility for the management of advanced funds and acquittal requirements, as well as all insurance risks of the project.
	General Conditions:
	 Planting projects must use indigenous plants of local province. A detailed species list can be provided by contacting the Environment Grants Officer of Bushland Management Team about plant selection. Demonstration of site considerations, preparation and ongoing maintenance should be included in the application.
	 Council approval (including necessary permits) must be gained for any projection being undertaken on Council owned or managed land.
	 Applications for projects on private land may be considered, but must fulfil existing assessment criteria and demonstrate benefit to the wider commun or positive impacts to public land.
	- To receive grant funds successful applicants must enter into a Funding Agreement with Council and adhere to all conditions outlined in the

agreement.

Ineligible

You **cannot** apply, and Council **will not fund** an Environment Projects Grant if:

- × Re-current or ongoing financial support from Council is needed (one -off facilitation costs may be considered for community education costs).
- You wish to fund project management or administrative support, contributions to salary costs, or ongoing operational costs and labour costs associated with the implementation of your project.
- **x** Costs are to cover auspicing fees for groups or organisations.
- × Catering expenses associated with your project.
- × Your project is being funded through another source.
- The project is a responsibility of another level of government (e.g. State or Federal).
- × A clear statement of your organisation's financial position cannot be provided upon request.
- × Funding is intended to be used for project planning i.e. master plans, landscape plans, building plans.
- × Your activity is solely for private gain or commercial purposes.
- The purpose of your project is of political or religious nature (unless the project is non-denominational demonstrating broader community benefit).
- Money will be used prizes, donations, sponsorship or gifts.
- × Your organisation has not satisfactorily acquitted a previous grant or has existing funds owing to Council.

Your Application

All applicants are required to read the guidelines and discuss their project idea with the Environment Grants Officer before starting a submission.

Some preference may be given to those groups or individuals who have not previously received a grant from Banyule City Council. Any conflicts of interest present in the committee are declared with members excused from partaking in the discussion of the relevant application.

Decisions on the allocation of the grants will be based on the recommendations of Council Officers and decision of BEAC. All applicants will be notified of the outcome of their application via email.

Evaluation, Agreement and Acquittal

If your application is successful, you will be required to enter into an agreement with Council and adhere to all conditions outlined in it. One of the requirements will be to show your expenditure to acquit the funds. The due date of this will be stipulated within the agreement and will generally be 12 months after any grant money is awarded.

All successfully funded projects will complete and submit an online acquittal form through SmartyGrants detailing:

- Financial evidence (receipts from spending).
- Marketing material (videos, photographs, flyers).
- Proof of In-kind contributions.

You will receive notification when your acquittal has been successful.

Any variations or modifications to the project that alter the original approval to funding being spent must have consent from Council. All requests will be considered, and the applicant will be notified of Council's decision. Approval must be received before alterations can proceed otherwise Council reserves the right to cease funding.

Variations should be applied for via Smarty Grants and will be considered by the Director City Development on advice from Council Officers and BEAC.

Definitions

ABN: Australian business number (ABN) is a unique 11-digit identifier that makes it easier to identify your business to the government and community.

Acquittal: The process of the funding recipient reports to the funding body on how it has expended all funds in accordance with the terms and conditions of the funding agreement on completion of the project.

Auspice: A organisation who manages grant funding on your behalf when only organisations, and not individuals or groups of individuals can apply.

Incorporated Association: A registered legal entity usually established for recreational, cultural or charitable purposes. It makes a group of people a single legal entity with certain rights and legal protections.

In-Kind Contribution: Contribution of a service, labor (volunteer time), venue, materials or goods provided instead of cash. Organisations or groups contribute their own resources to a project that may reduce the amount of actual dollars needed. This doesn't dismiss that these contributions would had to have been paid for should these donations have not existed.
