Budget 2025/26: delivering for our community

Banyule is in a secure and sustainable financial position as we adopt our Budget for 2025/26.

Council's focused on maintaining services and upgrading facilities to meet community need while managing debt.

Delivering a surplus and reducing debt

Banyule has delivered 15 straight years of debt reduction, ensuring Council is financially sustainable into the future.

This gives residents and businesses the confidence to contribute, invest and make a home in our community.

Council has reduced a \$3.5 million interest bill in 2013-14 to a projected \$1.4 million in 2025/26. This is an extra \$2.1 million per year going into community services rather than the interest bill.

Supporting residents with cost of living pressures

The challenging economic outlook is putting pressure on Council and household budgets alike.

We are keeping rate increases within the Victorian Government's rate cap of 3%, below Consumer Price Index increases.

We offer a relief package for ratepayers who need support. People experiencing financial hardship may be eligible for a partial waiver on their rates up to \$566.50

Improving our local community

Initiatives to improve our neighbourhood:

- Completing Watsonia Town Square: \$2M
- Upgrading College Views reserve and adding new playground facilities: \$330,000
- Upgrading Bundoora Tennis Club (Stage 2): \$200,000
- Supporting Bundoora Secondary College Urban Agriculture Education Centre (pictured right): \$100,000
- Installing goal netting at NJ Telfer Reserve and upgrading the playground: \$90,000
