Reduce your costs

Concessions

Concessions are discounts or rebates that help with everyday costs like electricity, gas, water, transport, health care and education. To get most concessions, you need to hold a valid card.



- Health Care Card / Pensioner Concession Card** → issued by Centrelink
- Veterans' cards** → issued by Veterans' Affairs
- Seniors Card** → issued by Victorian Government

Once you have one of these cards, you can check what you're eligible for and apply for concessions.

What are you eligible for?

Children and young people



Child care

If you need help with child care costs, you can apply for the Child Care Subsidy (CCS), which helps cover fees at approved child care services. You may also be eligible for the Additional Child Care Subsidy (ACCS) for extra support in certain situations.

To access these payments, make a claim through your Centrelink online account via myGov or the Express Plus Centrelink app before your child starts care. You'll need to confirm your child's enrolment and keep your details up to date so you receive the right subsidy.

Help with school costs

If you're having trouble with school costs, start by talking to your child's school. They can help with payment plans and let you know about support programs like State Schools' Relief, which provides uniforms, shoes, stationery, and other essential school items, or the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund, which helps cover costs for school activities and excursions.

You can discuss your needs with the principal, assistant principal, or student wellbeing staff, who can apply for support on your behalf.

Young people

Banyule Youth Services offers free and inclusive programs and activities for young people aged 12–25. These include workshops, creative arts, school holiday activities, social and cultural programs, and skill-building opportunities. Youth workers also provide support and connections to help young people engage with their community.






