Banyule boasts both a rich cultural heritage and a dynamic creative community.



We deliver these experiences to our community through art exhibitions, community festivals, networking events, workshops, public art, and much more.


We hope that through these experiences, your creativity will be stimulated, you will transcend the everyday and gain new knowledge, ideas and insights through the arts.

Ivanhoe Library & Cultural Hub



Ivanhoe Library & Cultural Hub is Banyule's community cultural venue, located in the heart of Ivanhoe. A new home for the arts in Banyule, our program allows our community to engage in meaningful cultural activities and transform the Ivanhoe Civic Precinct into a cultural destination.

ILCH is an inclusive, community-centred creative hub that welcomes everyone. The Banyule Arts & Culture program provides a dynamic mix of events, activities and performances together with outstanding

exhibitions, cultural experiences and access to information and learning.

At the Ivanhoe Library & Cultural Hub, Banyule Council's Arts Team curate and program two art galleries, two artist studios and an informal theatrette.

Art Gallery 275 is our museum standard art gallery, purpose-built to host specially-curated exhibitions, and to display the Banyule Art Collection.

Loft 275 is our new professional, flexible gallery space for Banyule-based artists and community cultural groups. This exciting gallery is curated to showcase exhibitions by locals through an annual application process.

Mungga Artist Studios are two dedicated studios for local artists to undertake a residency, where they are able to develop and informally display artworks, showcase their process in a public context and deliver creative workshops to the community.

Mungga means 'to make' in Woiwurrung language.

Yarra-me Djila Theatrette is our flexible indoor/outdoor presentation space. The theatrette is home to daily library storytimes, and hosts talks, performances, film screenings, and is available for community bookings.

Yarra-me Djila means 'open play' in Woiwurrung language.






Peta Clancy is a descendant of the Bangerang Nation from south-eastern Australia. She's a senior lecturer at Monash University's Art Design & Architecture

Harmony Week is celebrated annually in March, and is centred on Harmony Day on 21 March. It coincides with the United Nations Day for Elimination of Racial Discrimination and Harmony, and is celebrated around Australia.

Here in Banyule, we are home to people from many diverse backgrounds and experiences. Data from our last survey revealed that 24.5% of our community were born overseas, with ancestry from 125 different countries; there are 79 languages other than English spoken in Banyule; and more than half of our community practice some kind of religion.

We embrace our diverse cultures by celebrating significant dates and cultural observances. This exhibition highlights some of these events, so that you can join us in experiencing the breadth and beauty of the diversity in our community.

Mass, Drawing Intensive is an ambitious exhibition of artwork based on the nude human figure. The exhibition will feature artworks created by eight Banyule Artists during a three-day drawing intensive held inside the Loft 275 gallery space.

The drawing intensive is inspired by a similar immersive program offered by the New York Studio School (NYSS) in the USA.

Artists are encouraged to investigate how they interpretate the world through processes of image making. To do this they are challenged to step outside of their normal ways of creating art. They bravely experiment with scale, new materials, techniques and ways of seeing and portraying the human form.

The resulting exhibition will include works that are raw and uncensored, unable to be altered once the intensive program is over.

Barrbunin Beek means 'happy place' in Woiwurrung language.





They were developed in response to growing interest from artists looking for different ways to showcase their creative ideas, as well as to create contemporary art encounters for the community.




